Staff introduced new Public Works Director Bonnie Tam and new Economic Development Manager Linden Johnson. Ms. Tam and Mr. Johnson shared information regarding their respective backgrounds, education and experience. Chair Cuellar and Commissioners Friend and Sanchez welcomed Ms. Tam and Mr. Johnson to the San Fernando Team.

CONSENT CALENDAR

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner E. Friend motioned to approve the minutes of the May 14, 2026 Parks, Wellness and Recreation Commission meeting.

Commissioner F. Sanchez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously with the following roll call vote:

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ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

2. DISCUSS MULTIPLE TOPICS WITH PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVE- M. Perez addressed items G and H of the listed items and reported that she visited Pioneer and Layne Parks and identified where the missing cap belongs on the children's apparatus. The company was contacted and will send a replacement cap. It is not deemed a safety concern as it is located high up out of reach. She also took photos and reported graffiti at both parks on the *My San Fernando App*. The issues were addressed the following day. It is recommended that everyone report issues on the City App for a quick response and to track the status of the requests.

R. Mora followed up on the graffiti issue and echoed how effective the City App is in reporting requests and also stated that Public Works address graffiti issues daily.

Additionally, R. Mora and B. Tam addressed the list of items submitted for follow-up. Discussion ensued with the following outcome:

- Evaluate and present options (including visuals and cost estimates) for replacing plants in pots along Maclay corridor with native/hummingbird-friendly species at the next meeting.
- Assess the condition of exercise equipment at Recreation Park, determine if replacement is needed, and research potential grant funding for new fitness equipment and shade structures.
- Research insurance and liability implications of maintaining or replacing outdated exercise equipment at Recreation Park and report findings to the Commission.
- Conduct a nighttime walkthrough of Recreation Park and Pioneer Park to assess current lighting and identify areas needing additional or improved lighting; consider LED upgrades where feasible.
- Investigate and report on the feasibility of providing a water source (e.g., water barrel or access to hydrant) for newly planted vegetation at Cindy Montanez Natural Park, considering vandalism risks and maintenance requirements.
- Continue coordination with Police Department and Community Development to implement and schedule increased park patrols and address issues related to park closure times and safety, especially at Cindy Montanez Natural Park and Rudy Ortega Sr. Park.
- Update and maintain park signage, especially at Cindy Montanez and Rudy Ortega Parks, to clearly indicate park hours and improve enforcement of park closure.

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- Evaluate the feasibility of speed bumps and traffic calming measures around park facilities, including required studies and requirements for resident petitions, and report back to the Commission.
- Staff to check and replace any non-functioning lights at Recreation Park and other parks as needed.
- Look into the possibility of adding a water barrel or other water storage solution at Cindy Montanez Park for Boy Scout/Eagle Scout plantings, and coordinate with assigned maintenance staff for watering.

Chair Cuellar reminded commissioners that this body is an advisory board. Any items that incur a cost must be presented to City Council for approval. At next Safety and Transportation Commission meeting, she will raise the issue of overnight parking at parks and discuss potential solutions to address various parking needs. Lastly, she reported doing a walk-through of city parks and is happy to report that parks are clean, tidy and well kept. She thanked the Public Works staff for their hard work.

Commissioner Friend requested a presentation on the options for pollinator plants and costs to add plants to the pots on Maclay. She also inquired about the shade sales, repair of exercise equipment, and good lighting for safety. R. Mora will come back to the commission with cost and plant recommendations. B. Tam discussed looking into grant funding for fitness equipment at Rec. Park.

Commissioner Sanchez echoed Chair Cuellar's comments regarding the good work by Public Works staff in maintaining the parks. She also stated that previous meetings held discussion regarding utilizing pollinator plants such as milkweed and other types to attract pollinator species. She also inquired about possible liability due to having outdated fitness equipment that may also be in disrepair. In regard to shading, maybe consider a structure over the equipment that will be durable. Lastly the issue of lighting should be addressed due to safety issues, especially at Rudy Ortega and Cindy Montanez Park.

3. DEPARTMENT PROGRAMS AND SERVICES UPDATE- RCS staff shared information and updates on recent and upcoming activities from the City of San Fernando's Recreation and Community Services Department. They highlighted the pride flag raising ceremony, Memorial Day event, Senior Fest, and various ongoing programs including youth basketball, Mission City Baseball, and summer day camp. Upcoming events were announced including Foodzilla on June 27th, July 4th drone show, movies and concerts in the park, and soccer watch parties. Staff reminded the community about cooling centers activation when the temperature is 95+ degrees and promoted the new city website and app for service requests.

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STAFF COMMUNICATION

M. Perez reported on the Adobe Days event occurring this Saturday at the Andres Pico Adobe on Sepulveda and Brand Blvd. from 10am to 2pm. Staff Anthony Llamas will be on site to display the history of the Lopez Adobe.

COMMISSIONER UPDATES/REQUESTS TO AGENDIZE ITEM FOR DISCUSSION AT A FUTURE MEETING

Commissioner E. Friend discussed an incident that occurred during a pride event held at the Shadow Grove where two LAUSD teachers were attacked in the restroom. Commissioner Friend is asking how incidents like this could be prevented and how to involve SFPD to provide more protection specifically during pride events.

Chair Cuellar encourages businesses and the general public, to request additional patrol during events and to reach out to the Commander in advance and after any incidents. She will bring this concern to the attention of SFPD.

M. Perez chimed in and encouraged anyone with safety concerns to reach out to City Council and of course communication with SFPD is paramount.

Subject: San Fernando Police Department Update on Park Activity

RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

1. On February 8, 2024 the Parks, Wellness and Recreation Commission requested to receive quarterly updates from SFPD reporting on activity and crime in the parks.

ANALYSIS:

The recreational value of parks is integral to the well-being of the community and its residents, offering spaces for leisure, exercise, and social interaction. However, amid the serene environment of these public areas, parks also become focal points for various activities, both constructive and detrimental. As guardians of public safety, the City of San Fernando Police Department has diligently monitored and analyzed the trends in park activity and crime to ensure the continued enjoyment and safety of all park-goers.

The quarterly report aims to provide an overview of the recent activity and crime trends observed within the parks under the department's jurisdiction, which are the following:

- Recreation Park, 208 Park Ave.
- Layne Park, 120 N. Huntington St.

San Fernando Police Department Update on Park Activity

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- Las Palmas Park, 505 S. Huntington St.
- Pioneer Park, 828 Harding Ave.
- Rudy Ortega Senior Park, 2025 Fourth St.
- Cindy Montañez Natural Park, 801 Eight St.

The quarterly report will include a San Fernando City Parks Crime Trends table (Attachment “A”) illustrating information regarding police reports, moving citations, parking citations, traffic collisions and Community Resource Management (CRM’s) that occurred in and around the parks. The report will also provide a map view of the City with color-coded citations (Attachment “B”) to provide an overview of the information reported on the table.

In addition to providing the data, a representative from the Police Department will attend the PWRC meetings on a quarterly basis to present the report and answer any questions from the commission.
