FERNANDO TATAVIUM BAND OF MISSION INDIANS WATER TANK MURAL PROJECT AT RUDY ORTEGA SR. PARK- RCS Department Director Julio Salcedo provided background on the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of San Fernando and the Fernandeano Tataviam Band of Mission Indians, noting that the MOU was extended on March 10 after its original expiration in 2016.

2. SAN FERNANDO POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE ON PARK ACTIVITY- San Fernando Police Commander Brian Woodward provided an overview of recent citywide activity, including trends in drug- and alcohol-related offenses and outstanding warrants.

He reported on a quality-of-life assessment at Recreation Park with Chief Robert L. Valdez and RCS Director Julio Salcedo, where evidence of gambling, alcohol, and cigarettes was found.

RCS Director Julio Salcedo thanked the Police Department for their ongoing support of recreational programs.

3. INFORMATIONAL UPDATE ON THE COLLABORATION WITH THE WILD HORSE

FOUNDATION– RCS Director Julio Salcedo reported that he met with Yasiel Puig and his team regarding programming at the Puig House in partnership with UCLA. Programs include *Let's Play Outside Again*, individual and group counseling, and prenatal and parenting classes. The goal is to establish the site as a one-stop family resource center.

Mr. Salcedo also met with the pastor and principal of Glenoaks Christian Schools, located across the street from the Puig House.

Additional funding is being pursued through the City Manager's Office. There is no budget impact to the City, as an existing facility is being used.

Mr. Salcedo responded to commissioner questions, including the MOU expiration date. Chair Cuellar requested a future tour of the house. He also shared that a Head Start mobile classroom at Recreation Park is in development.

4. DISCUSS MULTIPLE TOPICS WITH PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVE- Tabled for next meeting.

5. CESAR E. CHAVEZ MEMORIAL RENOVATION PROJECT UPDATE- RCS Director Julio Salcedo met with the Ad Hoc Committee at the Cesar Chavez Memorial to review the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and clarify the responsibilities of Pueblo y Salud and the City of San Fernando. The MOU does not require either party to conduct maintenance or fundraising. Any proposed educational programming or renovations by Pueblo y Salud must receive prior City approval. The City may assist with fundraising efforts and waive facility fees for related educational programs. Pueblo y Salud plans to host future fundraisers.

The Public Works Department is exploring improvements to the memorial, including lighting, power washing, and replacement of stolen donor plaques.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Parks, Wellness and Recreation Commission make the following recommendations to City Council:

- a. Accept the donation of a Veteran Honor Engraving Project from a local group of San Fernando residents;
- b. Authorize Public Works to install the engraved granite slabs;
- c. Review and approve any necessary edits or modifications to the text;
- d. Authorize the group of San Fernando residents to host potential fundraisers at Las Palmas Park and waive any associated fees; and
- e. Authorize the group of San Fernando residents spearheading this project to host an unveiling ceremony for the public at Las Palmas Park once the first round of engravings is installed and the waiving of any associated fees.

BACKGROUND:

1. On September 25, 2024, Manny Granillo approached the Recreation and Community Services (RCS) Dept. staff about developing and displaying a plaque at Las Palmas Park commemorating former staff members, Julian Leon and Jess Margarito, for their contributions as Park Directors for the City of San Fernando.
2. On November 8, 2024, a group of San Fernando residents met with Recreation and Community Services (RCS) staff regarding the location and size of the plaque. The residents

were former neighborhood children whose lives were heavily influenced by the leadership of Julian Leon and Jess Margarito.

3. On February 3, 2025, RCS staff received a proof of the plaque.
4. On March 13, 2025, the Parks, Wellness, and Recreation (PWR) Commission monthly meeting, during which the Commission received a presentation regarding the proposed plaque donation and voted to recommend that City Council approve the donation, installation, and public unveiling of the plaque.
5. On April 7, 2025, City Council were presented with the project and voted to approve the proposed plaque donation, installation, and public unveiling of the plaque.
6. On August 9, 2025, the San Fernando residents had a plaque unveiling ceremony at Las Palmas Park.
7. On December 15, 2025, the San Fernando residents reached out to City staff proposing a new project for the Las Palmas Park Patio.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed Veteran Honor Engraving Project, funded by a group of San Fernando residents, seeks to expand upon the recently installed commemorative plaque at Las Palmas Park by adding engraved granite slabs that will be installed around the plaque in the Las Palmas Park patio. The engraved slabs will honor local veterans from the San Fernando community by displaying their names in a permanent and dignified manner. This effort is being led by community members Manny Granillo, Alfred Calzadillas, and Richard Villa, who have organized fundraising efforts to cover all associated costs.

The engraved granite slabs are proposed to be installed in the Las Palmas Park patio, surrounding the existing commemorative plaque. The residents have requested that the City's Public Works Department handle the installation at no cost to them, while the resident group will assume all expenses associated with the fabrication of the granite slabs, installation materials, and the unveiling ceremony. The central granite memorial slab plus the first round of engravings is anticipated to be installed this calendar year, with the potential for future rounds as additional veterans are nominated and funds are raised.

Public Works staff has reviewed the proposal and determined that the project is feasible. The patio area surrounding the existing plaque provides sufficient space for the installation of the engraved granite slabs. Staff has confirmed that minimal site preparation will be required, as the

patio surface is already in good condition. The installation will be coordinated with the resident group to ensure the slabs are properly aligned and securely set.

The Veteran Honor Engraving Project represents a meaningful and lasting tribute to the men and women from San Fernando who served in the United States Armed Forces. The engraved granite slabs will complement the existing commemorative plaque and transform the Las Palmas Park patio into a dedicated Veterans Honor Garden. Each granite slab will measure 3 feet wide by 16 inches tall and will accommodate approximately 12 names, with each veteran name engraved at 12 inches wide by 4 inches tall. The estimated cost per slab is approximately \$1,200, not including installation materials and associated labor costs. Eligibility will be limited to veterans who are current residents of San Fernando or who have an immediate family member residing in the City, consistent with the criteria established under the existing Veteran Banner Recognition Program. This type of public recognition not only honors the service and sacrifice of local veterans, but also fosters community pride and a shared sense of history among residents. Staff supports the project as a positive enhancement to the park and a fitting tribute to the City's veteran community.

The Commission's acceptance of this donation will formalize the City's partnership with the resident group and provide a clear path forward for the project. Staff is available to provide any additional information or support needed in this deliberation and will continue to coordinate with the resident group and Public Works on next steps following Commission approval.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The plaque will be paid by the local resident group. The installation will be provided by the Public Works Department at an estimated cost of \$600 in staff time.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that the Parks, Wellness and Recreation Commission make the following recommendations to City Council: accept the donation of the Veteran Honor Engraving Project from the group of San Fernando residents; authorize the Public Works Department to install the engraved granite slabs in the Las Palmas Park patio at an estimated cost of \$600 in staff time; and authorize the resident group to host fundraisers and an unveiling ceremony at Las Palmas Park with all associated rental fees waived. This project reflects the community's deep appreciation for the veterans of San Fernando and will create a lasting public space at Las Palmas Park that honors their service for generations to come. Staff is committed to supporting the resident group through every step of the process to ensure a successful and timely installation.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Parks, Wellness and Recreation (PWR) Commission receive and file an update on the specific items stipulated in the MOU between the Wild Horse Foundation and the City.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This item was added to the agenda by Chair Julie Cuellar at the October 9, 2025, Parks, Wellness and Recreation Commission Regular Meeting. Information on existing programming with Early Head Start and other collaborative opportunities has been discussed with the PWR Commission.

At the January 2026 PWR Commission meeting, Mr. Salcedo reported that he will be meeting with the Wild Horse Foundation toward the end of the month.

At the February 2026 PWR Commission meeting, RCS Director Julio Salcedo reported that he met with Yasiel Puig and his team regarding programming at the Puig House in partnership with UCLA with the goal to establish a one-stop family resource center. Mr. Salcedo also met with the pastor and principal of Glenoaks Christian Schools, located across the street from the Puig House. Also in the works is a Head Start mobile classroom that will be located at Recreation Park.

BUDGET IMPACT

There is no impact to the budget by discussing this item.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The PWR Commission added several agenda items at the October 9, 2025 PWR Commission regular meeting. This agenda item was tabled at the PWR Commission meetings held in December 2025, January and February of 2026. The PWR Commission is requesting information and updates on the following items:

- a. Update on adding plants to the existing pots along Maclay Street to attract hummingbirds
- b. Adding shade sails and repairing exercise equipment at Recreation Park
- c. Adding lighting to Recreation Park and Pioneer Park
- d. Status of the ground cover at Recreation Park

BUDGET IMPACT

There is no budget impact incurred by discussing and receiving an update on the aforementioned items with the Public Works Department.

Subject: Cesar E. Chavez Memorial Renovation Project Update

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Parks, Wellness, and Recreation Commission:

- a. Discuss Ad Hoc Committee Updates;
- b. Continue to meet with Pueblo Y Salud until a renovation plan for the Memorial Plaza can be developed; and
- c. Provide staff direction as appropriate.

BACKGROUND:

1. On June 7, 1993, the City Council approved of declaring March 31 an official City holiday honoring the late farmworker and civil rights leader, Cesar E. Chavez, thus becoming the first City in the country to establish the Cesar E. Chavez Holiday.
2. In 2004, the City of San Fernando in collaboration with the Cesar E. Chavez Commemorative Committee honored the great civil rights and labor leader through the creation of the largest Cesar E. Chavez Memorial in the nation.
3. On October 6, 2014, the City Council approved a partnership with Pueblo Y Salud for fundraising efforts to repair and restore the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial.
4. On March 14, 2023, Commissioner Lopez requested information regarding the condition and possible beautification of the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial.
5. On April 11, 2023, the PWRC directed staff to draft a letter to Pueblo Y Salud that would start a potential collaboration to restore the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial Plaza.

6. On May 11, 2023, the PWRC tabled discussion on the item until the Commissioners had an opportunity to review the MOU with Pueblo Y Salud and provide feedback on the draft letter to Pueblo Y Salud.
7. On June 8, 2023, an Ad Hoc Committee (Commissioners Lopez & Gonzales) was formed to gather information on the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial and how renovations would be funded.
8. On August 17, 2023, the Ad Hoc Committee and the RCS Director met with Ruben Rodriguez of Pueblo Y Salud.
9. In 2024, the Ad Hoc Committee met with RCS Director Julio Salcedo to review the existing MOU with Pueblo Y Salud. The Ad Hoc agreed to meet after the July 11, 2024 PWR Commission regular meeting
10. On August 9, 2024, the Ad Hoc, RCS Department staff and Pueblo Y Salud met and reviewed the MOU agreement. Consensus was reached to schedule a tour of the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial and Recreation Park Facility.
11. As a result of the November 5, 2024, San Fernando City Council elections, Robert Gonzales and Patty Lopez would no longer serve on the PWRC.
12. At the PWRC meeting held on April 10, 2025, Commissioner Erica Friend requested to add an agenda item to select new members for the Ad Hoc Committee.
13. At the May 8, 2025 PWRC regular meeting, Commissioners Erica Friend and Flor Sanchez volunteered to be Ad Hoc Committee members.
14. At the July 10, 2025 PWRC regular meeting, RCS Director J. Salcedo reported that the City Council Ad Hoc has reactivated to continue working with Pueblo Y Salud on this project.
15. At the August 14, 2025 PWR Commission meeting, Mr. Salcedo informed the commission that a meeting and walk-through of the memorial was held with City Council, the Public Works Director and the RCS Director. A day of service may be planned in March of 2026 for a community clean up. More information will be provided as it becomes available.
16. At the February 12, 2026, PWR Commission meeting, Mr. Salcedo reported on meeting with the Ad Hoc Committee to review the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to clarify the responsibilities of Pueblo y Salud and the City of San Fernando. The MOU does not require either party to conduct maintenance or fundraising. Any proposed educational programming or renovations by Pueblo y Salud must receive prior City approval. The City may assist with fundraising efforts and waive facility fees for related educational programs. Pueblo y Salud

plans to host future fundraisers. The Public Works Department is exploring improvements to the memorial, including lighting, power washing, and replacement of stolen donor plaques.

ANALYSIS:

The City has an MOU with Pueblo Y Salud (PYS), which allows access for the organization to program and maintain the monument. In past years, PYS has spearheaded fundraising efforts to help the City offset costs associated with the restoration and maintenance of the monument. The Department of Public Works reinstalled commemorative plaques that had been stolen. Staff reported that the installation involved cutting into the base and the use of industrial strength adhesive to secure the new plaque in place. Public Works also conducts periodic maintenance, which includes trimming shrubs, removing weeds, and cleaning graffiti.

The Ad Hoc committee has met regularly with Ruben Rodriguez, from Pueblo Y Salud, to discuss possible renovations for the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial Plaza. The discussions have revolved around the history of the Memorial. Mr. Rodriguez noted that Pueblo Y Salud had started investigating renovations to the Memorial back in 2014, but the project stalled and had been dormant for some time.

In order to proceed with the beautification efforts of the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial, it is recommended that the Ad Hoc Committee Members stay informed on updates provided by the City Council Ad Hoc and continue collaborating with Pueblo Y Salud to identify funding options for this project.

BUDGET IMPACT:

There is no budget to review and discuss this item. However, any possible beautification or restoration of the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial will incur a cost. Per Sec. 54-67. - Incurring financial liability - Neither the Commission nor any person connected with the Commission shall incur any financial liability in the name of the City.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that the Parks, Wellness, and Recreation Commission and Ad Hoc Committee members to continue collaborating with Pueblo Y Salud and continue to look into funding opportunities and provide staff with direction as appropriate.
