Commissioner Z. Rodriguez supports Commissioner Mohr's comments. Commissioner Z. Rodriguez commented on the three tiers of traffic: Engineering, education and enforcements and would like to focus on the first two.

Vice Chair Cuellar made the following comments: green means go, yellow means slow down and red means stop. Don't go through a red light.

**Subject:** February 2026 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

### **ANALYSIS:**

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of January 2026, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:**

#### **1. Disaster Council**

On Monday, February 23, 2026, the San Fernando Disaster Council met in the City Council Chambers. Representatives from the City Council, Police Department, LAFD, the American Red Cross, LAUSD, and other volunteer organizations participated in the quarterly meeting to discuss disaster preparedness.

**NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:**

1. On Thursday, February 5, 2026, at about 11:45 AM, SFPD detectives executed a search warrant related to a fraud investigation in the 12600 block of Bromont Avenue. A female adult was arrested for forgery.
2. On Friday, February 6, 2026, SFPD officers monitored school walkouts throughout the City. The demonstrations were peaceful and concluded at approximately 2:30 PM.
3. On Friday, February 6, 2026, at approximately 4:50 PM, SFPD officers responded to a Flock ALPR notification of a stolen vehicle in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard. Officers located the vehicle traveling toward North Maclay Avenue, conducted a traffic stop, and arrested a male subject for taking a vehicle without the owner's consent, possession of a controlled substance, driving without a license, and an outstanding warrant.
4. On Saturday, February 7, 2026, around 7:50 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a fight in progress in the 300 block of North Maclay Avenue. The suspect had punched a business owner who confronted him for digging through trash. The suspect was arrested for battery and possession of drug paraphernalia.
5. On Saturday, February 7, 2026, at about 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject dousing a vehicle with gasoline. The subject, who stated that he was going to ignite his vehicle, was arrested for attempted arson.
6. On Monday, February 9, 2026, at approximately 7:00 PM, SFPD officers assisted the Chino Police Department in locating a vehicle involved in the kidnapping of three children. Officers located the vehicle near Newton Street and 7th Street. The children were safely recovered and released to their mother by Chino PD detectives.
7. On Tuesday, February 10, 2026, around 7:15 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of vandalism in the 1100 block of Celis Street. A male juvenile was arrested for vandalism.
8. On Thursday, February 12, 2026, at about 11:00 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop near San Fernando Road and San Fernando Mission Boulevard. The driver was arrested for reckless driving, driving with a suspended license, operating an unregistered vehicle on a highway, failure to display license plates, and an outstanding warrant.
9. On Friday, February 13, 2026, SFPD officers responded to a report of a female subject heard screaming in the 1000 block of O'Melveny Street. Following an investigation, officers arrested a male subject for domestic battery and damaging a communication device to prevent a call for help.

**February 2026 Notable Police Department Activities**

10. On Friday, February 20, 2026, at approximately 8:35 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject assaulting a female subject in the 1100 block of Truman Street. Following an investigation, officers arrested the male subject for felony domestic violence.

11. On Saturday, February 21, 2026, at about 7:35 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject hiding behind vehicles in the 100 block of Harps Street. Following an investigation, the subject was arrested for an outstanding warrant, providing false identification to a police officer, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

12. On Sunday, February 22, 2026, around 12:20 AM, SFPD officers responded to street takeover in the 1000 block of Arroyo Avenue. Upon their arrival, the vehicles dispersed.


