On May 7, 2026, Commissioner Mohr agendaized this item for the June 4, 2026, Transportation and Public Safety Commission Meeting.

Subject: May 2026 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of May 2026, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. Walk the Block

On Wednesday, May 6, 2026, SFPD personnel joined City staff and eight community members for a "Walk the Block" event. Participants walked approximately one mile beginning at Pioneer Park. During the walk, Police and City personnel engaged with residents to discuss community needs in the area and showcased the functions of the My San Fernando app to report ongoing concerns.

2. ABC Shoulder Tap and Minor Decoy Operations

On Tuesday, May 12, 2026, SFPD detectives, officers, an ABC agent and two minor decoys conducted a grant-funded shoulder tap operation, focusing on adults who purchase alcohol for people under the age of 21. During the operation, seven adults were contacted by the

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minor decoys and asked to purchase alcohol. The operation resulted in two misdemeanor citations for furnishing alcohol to a minor.

On Wednesday, May 13, 2026, SFPD detectives and an ABC agent conducted a grant-funded Minor Decoy Operation in which minor decoys attempted to purchase alcohol from 10 different businesses. The operation resulted in two misdemeanor "Promise to Appear" citations for furnishing alcohol to a minor.

3. **DUI Saturation Patrol**

On Sunday, May 24, 2026, SFPD officer conducted a DUI/DUID Saturation Patrol from 6 PM to 2:00 AM. During the operation, funded by California Highway Patrol Cannabis Tax Fund Grant Program funds, officers issued six traffic citations, one parking citation, and arrested two drivers for driving under the influence.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. On Friday, May 1, 2026, at approximately 8:40 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of an individual transporting two City light poles on a bicycle. Following an investigation, a male subject was arrested for stealing light poles from the City's bike path.
2. On Saturday, May 2, 2026, around 2:40 AM, SFPD officers responded to a mutual aid call regarding a gang fight in Glendale.
3. On Monday, May 3, 2026, at about 3:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a driver asleep at the wheel near Truman Street and South Maclay Avenue. Following an investigation, the driver was arrested for driving under the influence.
4. On Wednesday, May 6, 2026, at approximately 9:25 AM, while patrolling Rudy Ortega Park, an SFPD officer observed a subject vaping in the park and contacted him. Following an investigation, the subject was arrested for an outstanding warrant.
5. On Wednesday, May 6, 2026, around 10:20 AM, SFPD officers responded to a fatal vehicle versus motorcycle collision. LAFD and LAPD also responded and handled the incident because it occurred outside the City limits.
6. On Wednesday, May 6, 2026, at about 7:40 PM, SFPD officers responded to a GoGov report of a homeless encampment near Lazard Street and Truman Street. Officers contacted three subjects, issued warnings and disbursed the encampment.
7. On Thursday, May 7, 2026, at approximately 8:15 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of shoplifting at Target in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard. Following an investigation, an adult male was arrested for shoplifting/petty theft with priors and possession of drug paraphernalia.

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8. On Thursday, May 7, 2026, around 11:45 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a domestic disturbance in the 100 block of North Huntington Street. Following an investigation, an adult female was arrested for public intoxication and resisting, delaying, or obstructing an Officer.

9. On Friday, May 8, 2026, at about 4:05 PM, SFPD officers responded to a traffic collision in the 1900 block of Eighth Street. Following an investigation, one driver was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol and driving without a license.

10. On Sunday, May 10, 2026, at approximately 4:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of vandalism in the 1800 block of Seventh Street. Following an investigation, an adult female was arrested for assault with a deadly weapon and vandalism.

11. On Monday, May 11, 2026, around 12:20 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a Flock ALPR notification regarding stolen license plates affixed to a vehicle and conducted a traffic enforcement stop of the vehicle near Brand Boulevard and Kewen Street. Following an investigation, a male subject was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of burglary tools, possession of drug paraphernalia, and driving without a license.

12. On Monday, May 18, 2026, at approximately 10:00 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop near San Fernando Road and Bleeker Street. Following an investigation, a male subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine.

13. On Monday, May 18, 2026, at about 9:35 PM, SFPD officers responded to request for a welfare check regarding possible false imprisonment in the 500 block of Hagar Street. Following an investigation, one subject was arrested for possession of metal knuckles, possession of a controlled substance while armed with a loaded firearm and possession of a controlled substance. A second subject was arrested for battery on a peace officer without injury and obstructing a peace officer while in the course of duty.

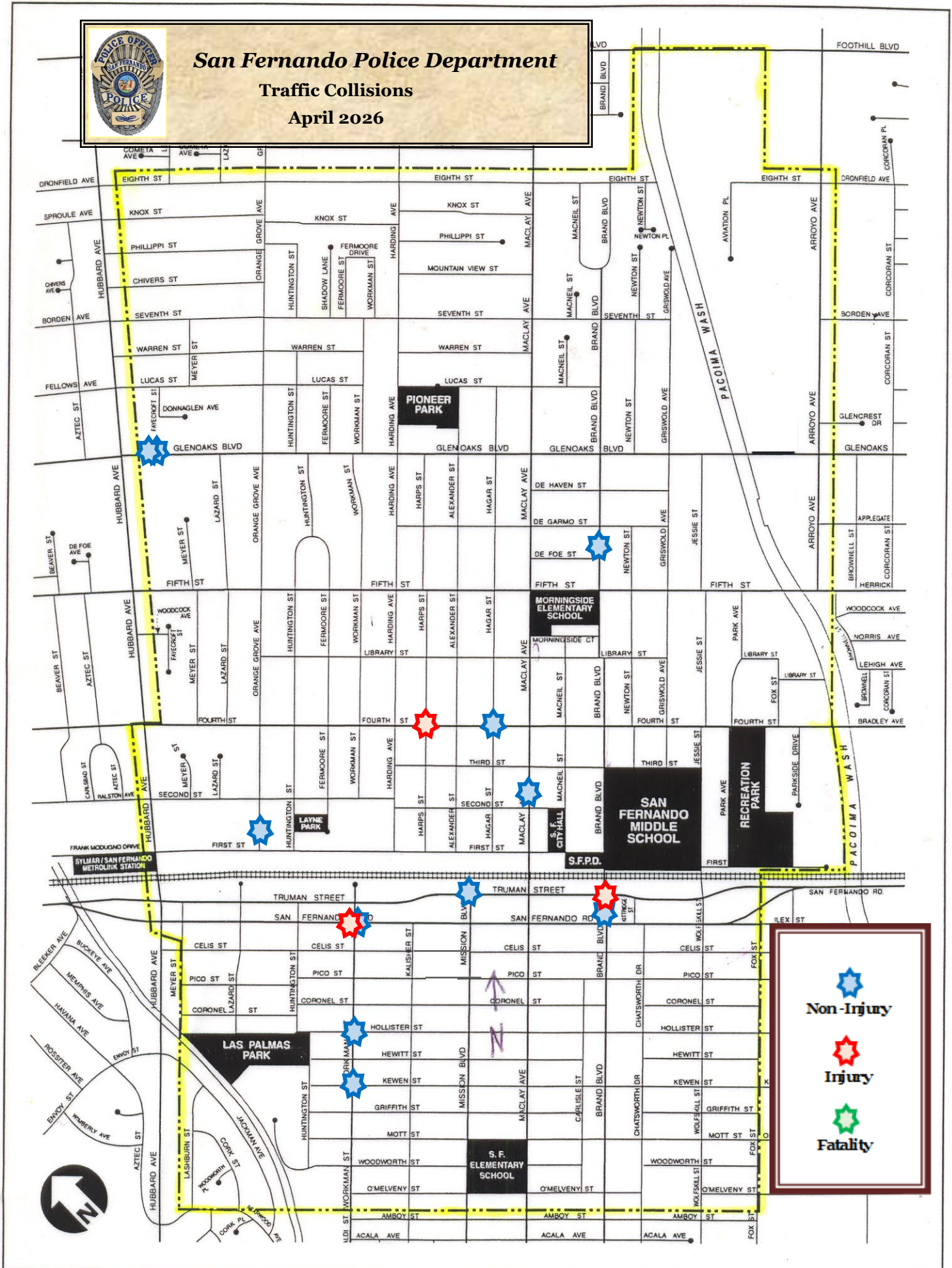
